That night, we slept at altitudes of 3000 meters above sea level and were in fact, sleeping above the clouds!

For all of our hard work, we got to finish the trip with a friendly football match with the villagers. The Adventurous Journey was a memorable and fun experience where the International Awards Students gained a lot of knowledge, skills and experiences.
